The Parish Council maintain all the above land and property. Land at Hurst Road and the Centenary Copse are owned by the District Council but leased to the Parish Council who maintain them.

The Parish Council Planning Committee makes valuable observations to the local planning authority (New Forest District Council and the National Park Authority), on every single planning application and all tree works orders for the Parish, which are considered by the relevant bodies when making their final decisions.

The Parish Council employs a full time Parish Clerk, a part time Planning/Assistant Clerk for 20 hours per week.

Producing the annual budget takes several months (including several working group meetings) and is then passed through to the full Parish Council Meeting, which is open to the public and to which residents are invited to attend and contribute to the process under a Public Participation Scheme (details of which are available from the Parish Office).

The annual expenditure budget for **2024/25** was £226,279. To meet the budget, the Parish Council needed a precept of £214,700 (the amount requested from New Forest District Council) this represented an increase of £11.76 per household per year (Band D) 19.4%.

2025/26

Due to the increase in employers' national insurance, the continuing increases in materials and other administrative costs out of the Parish Council's control, the **2025/26** expenditure budget has been set at £245,373. To meet this budget the Parish Council needs a precept of £239,400, this represents an increase of £5.91 per household per year (Band D) 8.1%.

Parish Council Achievements in Partnership with Village Groups, for 2024/2025

- Natural England Higher Level Stewardship grazing agreement continues with the clearing of several scrub sections at Studland Common as well as stump grinding to all cleared areas.
- Programme to manage the Upper & Lower Pleasure Grounds.
- Repairs to MEG Bridge and Boardwalk and Bridges near to Mill Meadow Pond
- Complete refurbishment of the Chris Walford Pavilion at Barnes Lane Recreation Ground
- Further planting and landscaping at the Community Meadow

- Reduction of all Parish owned hedges to 4.5ft in height.
- Continued upgrade of footpaths, culverts, bridges ditches and revetments in the Upper and Lower Pleasure Grounds.
- Continuing to upgrade and repair benches along the Cliff Top, Keyhaven and the Village Centre.
- New Picnic tables at Carrington Lane Play Park
- Removal of Scrub and Hedge Encroachment at Barnes Lane Recreation Ground & Carrington Lane Play Area.
- Replacement climbing unit at Carrington Lane Play Park
- New Picnic Benches next to Needles Eye Café
